Our mission to engage and empower the youth through a Youth Forum will give our young residents a voice in shaping our town's future. Lastly, the use of Community Infrastructure Levy funds for local projects will be subject to resident input, guaranteeing voices across the community are heard.

Planning & Transport Committee

In the realm of housing and planning, our focus is on the monitoring review of the Battle Neighbourhood Plan and discussions with developers will ensure the best possible facilities for our residents. sustainability, **Environmental** impact, and biodiversity considerations in planning decisions will safeguard our town's natural beauty. In transportation, we're committed to reducing traffic congestion and pollution by working toward the reclassification of the A2100 to a C road. The adoption of a 20mph speed limit, reviewing overflow car park operations, and close collaboration with transportation partners, along with support for green transport initiatives, will improve the town's transport infrastructure.



In summary, this four-year Plan represents a comprehensive vision for the future of Battle, rooted in the well-being of our residents and the preservation of our unique heritage and environment. The Council has full faith that, together, we will continue to **build a thriving**, **safe**, **and sustainable community** that we can all be proud to call home.

The Smoking Bull Inn do a mean burger and The Sweet Olive is good for a Sunday lunch. For exquisite cured meats and cheese platters, Sarah's Wine Cellar is a top choice. There's so much choice!

Hometown Honours

Thank you to all volunteers and residents

You may remember reading about the **Battle in Bloom Awards** reception in the summer newsletter. It was a vibrant affair, filled with trophies and prizes celebrating the marvellous gardens of residents' homes and wonderful floral displays all year round by our local businesses. Did you know though, that this competition is a stepping stone to something even grander? It is part of a nationwide competition, **Britain in Bloom**, run by the Royal Horticultural Society.

Our regional competition is **South and South East in Bloom** (SSEIB), which covers Kent, Surrey, East Sussex, West Sussex,

the Isle of Wight, Hampshire, East & North Dorset and East Wiltshire. There are many categories, including 'In Your Neighbourhood' for small groups.

Entrants are judged on their achievements in three areas: **Horticultural Excellence**; **Environmental Responsibility**; **and Community Participation**. These are the pillars upon which the awards are bestowed, as per the Royal Horticultural Society's medals - Gold, Silver Gilt, Silver and Bronze.

Battle entered three main categories this year: **The Almonry Garden**, which is nurtured and maintained by Beautiful Battle and this **achieved a Gold Award** in the 'Small Parks' category. **Battle Cemetery achieved a Silver Gilt Award**. **Battle Town itself achieved a Gold Award** in the 'Small Town' category!



Back in July, the judge toured the town, visiting the Almonry Garden, the Recreation Ground, Wellington Court, Abbey Court, Abbey Green, Battle Abbey, the Abbey Hotel, St Mary's Churchyard, Chequers Corner, Lake Field and Battle Cemetery. At each venue, he spent time talking to the hosts about their particular projects and tales of horticultural achievements. The iudge also representatives from Wild About Battle, Beautiful Battle, Battle Yarn Bombers and the Council's Grounds Staff, who impressed him with their enthusiasm. The judge noted Battle's strong sense of community and its heartfelt commitment to preserving the environment.

On the subject of the environment, SSEIB trialled a new set of special awards this year which will be used by all regions/nations of Britain in Bloom from 2024. Battle, never one to shy away from innovation,

achieved a **Gold Award in the Biodiversity & Environmental Innovation** category, in which our efforts to increase opportunities for pollinators, plants, nature, and the natural landscape were judged.

For those who've been curious about why certain retired Town Councillors and some wonderful residents were spending an inordinate amount of time weeding pavements, tidying flower displays and helping in the cemetery, you now know - it was all about a Quest For Gold and a mission of blooming brilliance that continues to unite our community and honour the marvels of our environment.







Young Leaders of Battle Unlock Your Potential

We firmly believe that young individuals possess invaluable insights that can contribute to making Battle an even more vibrant place to live, learn, and explore.

A new initiative, **Battle Youth Forum** has been established with the primary aim of providing young people with a platform to express ideas, ask questions, and make a tangible impact on our community. Our goal is to invite **open and honest dialogues** between our youth and the leaders of our town.





- Ask Questions: Seek answers and propose changes that you believe would benefit our town.
- Collaborate: Work alongside other young minds to create and present community projects.
- Meet Regularly: Engage in discussions about crucial issues in our community



How Does It Work? Here's a breakdown of how the Youth Forum operates:

- Application Process: You can apply to be part of the Youth Forum. We are looking for two students each from years 5 and 6 at Battle & Langton and Netherfield schools, and two students each from years 9 and 11 at Battle Abbey School and Claverham.
- Uniformed Groups: The three primary uniformed groups in Battle (ATC, Scouts, and Guides) can also apply for two spots each.
- **Term Length:** In the first year, students in years 6 and 11 will serve for one year, while students in years 5 and 9 will serve for two years.
- During each meeting: two Councillors will be present to provide guidance, ensuring that discussions are impartial and open. The Youth Forum will appoint its leader, establish rules,

Stitching History Together - M L X V I

The Almonry Tapestry of decorated Roman Numbers, M L X V I, (1066) has made great progress thanks to all the new stitchers, both local and visitors, including enthusiastic folks from far and wide, even Australia! The first two numbers, M and L are nearly finished and we have started on the X.

What's truly heartwarming is that people of all ages, both women and men, have been learning the **ancient stitching techniques used in the legendary Bayeux Tapestry**, which tells the tale of post -1066 history - although here's the twist – we're not battling the elements like the Bayeux Tapestry stitchers did; we've got warm rooms and lighting that even the Romans would envy!

Highlights from the Clerk

Welcome to New Councillors: Chelsey Sprong joins Andy Ratcliffe as newly co-opted members for the Watch Oak Ward. We bid farewell to Cllr Stripp who has resigned Council duties to spend time with a growing family and business. Congratulations and gratitude are expressed.

Pavilion Project: Following disappointing advice that applications for a grant from the Football Foundation are not currently available, alternative sources of funding are being researched to allow the much-needed Pavilion rebuild to proceed as soon as possible. Contributions from local and district Community Infrastructure Levy



(CIL) funds are in place but there remains a £150k shortfall. A Pavilion Plan Task & Finish Group, comprising four Councillors and three appropriately qualified residents have now completed its task and the Plan will be published on the Council's website shortly.

Fun Times for Little Ones: Despite the wintry weather, we're excited to introduce new play equipment at the Rec, providing our youngest residents with exciting play options. Junior Park Run: The Rec Health Pathway now hosts Junior Park Run every Sunday at 9am offering a fantastic 2k event for our junior community members (4-14 yr olds). The 2km course starts by the top play park and juniors are in sight of a marshal at all times.

Finally, George Meadow! Necessary repairs to the wall and a new gate have given Council the opportunity to provide convenient access to the High Street and Tills Courtyard shops. We hope that this small development might provide another gateway (literally) to our local shops and enterprises. The Gate is open from 8:00am to 4:00pm, Monday to Friday.



Our printer's process is the most environmentally friendly printing can be. They use very limited chemicals for cleaning; inks are vegetable based; printing plates are recycled and recyclable. Papers and boards are FSC certified, which means all materials have come from a sustainable forest. There is now a belief that using recyclable products, rather than recycled materials, is better for the

environment due to the impact of the actual recycling process, this is yet to be proved either way but noticeably most paper suppliers are opting for the recyclable route. The Council will continue to work with suppliers to lower our impact on the environment wherever possible.
